- Are we to report our rating by averaging both SLO percentages together?

Each SLO will have a numerical rating. Combining the SLO results together to obtain an average is not appropriate for this part of the process.

## SLO Scoring Matrix

| Percentage of students <br> that met or exceeded <br> growth target | Descriptive Rating | Numerical Rating |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| $90-100$ | Most Effective | 5 |
| $80-89$ | Above Average | 4 |
| $70-79$ | Average | 3 |
| $60-69$ | Approaching Average | 2 |
| 59 or less | Least Effective | 1 |

## Example:

1. Complete final assessment for each of your SLOs.
2. EACH SLO should have a percentage of students who achieved their SGM goal.
3. SLO \#1 had $73 \%$ of students achieve their goal and SLO \#2 had $84 \%$ of students achieve their goal.
4. This would give you a '3' for SLO \#1 and a '4' for SLO \#2.
5. Each SLO is worth $15 \%$ of your $50 \%$ SGM rating for a total of $30 \%$.
6. The other $20 \%$ is automatically a ' 4 ' because it is tied to the performance index of the district which in the 80s.
7. You do not have to worry about the average of your SLOs since this is completed on administrative end when your numbers are entered into eTPES.
